A dream, a gift, and a life changed forever

January 2018 is a special month that OSAAT volunteers will never forget. First, in a simple email, Suhas Bhosale, a young man that attended Mahadev Vidyalaya in Rawalgundwadi, broke the news that he was appointed to the position of Assistant Agriculture Officer by the Government of Maharashtra Department of Agriculture. Next, Bhimrao Basavaraj Vhankhande, another young man that attended the same school took the State Tax Inspector exam conducted by the State of Maharashtra, and passed with flying colors. As kids, both dreamed about graduating from college, getting a job that would allow them to make life better for themselves, their parents and their families. These are just the kind of success stories OSAAT folks have been waiting for since 2003.

Suhas credits his success to the infrastructure OSAAT built for his school in 2012. The villagers of Ravalgundvadi had rallied hard to make improvements to the school building but were not able to make much progress due to insufficient funds. The school's day to day operation was plagued with logistical issues, with classes being conducted at multiple locations in the village. Students found it difficult to focus on studies and felt neglected and abandoned. Suhas says OSAAT's helping hand made a huge difference by boosting the morale of the entire village, and motivated everyone to step up their commitment to the kids and their education.

Bhimrao says he used to think a lot about self respect and dignity, having been treated like a nobody from a little impoverished village. It all changed when OSAAT rebuilt his school from a disjointed, poorly constructed structure into a new facility with 8 new classrooms and toilets. Total strangers reaching out to help him and hundreds of poor kids like him was a life-changing experience, he says. It motivated him to work hard and excel in school.

Both Suhas and Bhimrao have grown up to be confident individuals now and see a much brighter future for themselves and their families. **Congratulations to Suhas and Bhimrao!**

For all the people associated with OSAAT - as a volunteer, a supporter or donor, their accomplishment is a precious gift! It is also the kind of gift that leaves one craving for more. After all, how often does one get to serve a needy person without expecting anything in return and see that it actually changed that person's life for good forever!

The event management team, along with OSAAT's Yuvashakti volunteers Shreya Basireddy and Vanya Vellore, worked with students of Bellarmine college Prep and Notredame High School on "Nazaara", a cultural event that has transformed into an annual fundraiser over the past 5 year, raising between \$5,000-\$6,500 for OSAAT each year. Mashia Rahman and Shruthi Shyam represented the student body and played key roles in conducting the event on March 24, 2018.

OSAAT received a grant from the Human Services committee of the Livermore temple for 2018, the fourth one to date. OSAAT was one of the honorees at the award ceremony held on March 24, 2018.

OSAAT's signature event "Naatya Raaga 2018", a 2-day music and dance extravaganza, was a huge success again, with 55 teams participating in the Dance contest and 40 teams participating in the Music contest. The event took place on April 7-8, 2018. As in the previous 11 years, the Indian music and dance schools came together for the event and showcased the best of their dancers and singers. Naatya Raaga has proven to be a prestigious platform for budding artists in the Bay area, with countless hours of practice towards perfection being the common denominator to earn a trophy. "Winning at Naatya Raaga earns you the instant recognition that you are a force to reckon with!", says Pradeep Joshi, founder of "Sangeet Dhwani", a Bay area organization that promotes local talents.



Team India's innovations

Team India is making steady progress with the barrage of requests for funding that followed the launch event in October 2018. After carefully analyzing the initial requests and multiple site visits, the team has shortlisted 13 schools, out of which construction of two schools has started in March-2018. Other 11 schools are in various phases of the review and approval process. The team has further streamlined several internal processes for screening the needs, assessing the overall impact on the local community, and best practices for eco-friendly construction.

A bird's eye view of projects in Progress:

Govt. Higher Primary School, Nagavalli: The groundbreaking ceremony was held on March 12th, 2018. OSAAT's commitment to the school is to refurbish and strengthen the Mangalore tiled structure of three existing classrooms, waterproofing of 5 classrooms, repair of existing toilets and build additional toilets for girls, provide water facility with storage tank and pump and provide clean drinking water facility. This project is expected to be completed by June 2018, cost around Rs. 15 lakhs.

Ittiam Systems, a Technology Solutions Provider, has sponsored the construction of the toilets, water facility and RO drinking water facility. Part sponsor of this school is Electronics & Communication Engineering Batch - 1992 of National Institute of Engineering (NIE) Mysore.

Govt. Upper Primary School, Aben, Manipur - This school is located in Aben village, Tamenglong district, considered a very backward district of Manipur. The only way to reach the school is a 4-wheel drive from the nearby town. The school is at 1.5 km walking distance from the settlement. OSAAT's commitment is to repair/refurbish the existing buildings of the school at a cost of about Rs. 6.00 lakhs. The MOU and Agreement with the stakeholders were signed on March 22, 2018.
